Baruch ata, Adonai Ehloheinu, mehlech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tzivanu l'had'lik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, Adonai, our God, Ruler of the Universe, who has sanctified us with Your commandments and commanded us to kindle the lights of Hanukkah.

בָּרוֹדְ אַתָּה יִיָ אֱלֹהֵינוֹ מֶלֶדְ הַעוֹלֶם שֵׁעֲשָׁה נִסִים לַאֲבוֹתֵינוֹ בַּיָמִים הָהֶם בַּוֹּמֵן הַזֶּה.

Baruch ata, Adonai Ehloheinu, mehlech haolam, sheasa nisim laavoteinu bayamim hahem baz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai, our God, Ruler of the Universe, who performed miracles for our ancestors in days of old at this time of the year.

On the first night only:

בָּרוּדְ אַתָּה יִיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם שֶהֶחֵיָנוּ וְקִיְּמָנוּ וְהִגִּיעָנוּ לַזְּמֵן הַזֶּה.

Baruch ata Adonai, Ehloheinu mehlech haolam, shehecheyanu v'kiyemanu v'higi'anu laz'man hazeh.

Blessed are you, Adonai, our God, Ruler of the Universe, who has kept us alive, sustained us, and enabled us to celebrate this season.
